Clean Sweep services are available to Walworth County household residents free-of-charge and pre-registration is not required.

What is “household hazardous waste?”

It is the unusable portion of a household product that contains volatile chemicals. These products can be identified by looking at labels, which are generally marked **CAUSTIC, ACID, DANGER, FLAMMABLE, WARNING, or POISON.**

Examples of Products to bring to Clean Sweep:

Home Products: ▪ silver polish ▪ mildew cleaner
▪ fluorescent bulbs ▪ rechargeable batteries

Automotive Products: ▪ motor oil ▪ antifreeze
▪ old fuel ▪ brake fluid ▪ engine/carb cleaner
▪ vehicle batteries ▪ transmission fluid

Pesticides / Herbicides: ▪ 2,4-D ▪ DDT
▪ ketone ▪ fungicides ▪ rodent bait ▪ Chlordane
▪ insecticides ▪ household fertilizer ▪ 2,4,5-T

Workshop: ▪ varnish ▪ paint thinner/stripper
▪ stains ▪ adhesives ▪ oil & lead-based paints
▪ photographic chemicals ▪ turpentine
▪ swimming pool chemicals ▪ gun-cleaning fluids

Pharmaceutical Collection Guidelines

Clean Sweep accepts outdated or unused prescription drugs and over-the-counter items.



- ✓ Pharmaceuticals will be collected **ONLY** at the locations and times shown on this brochure.
- ✓ Leave medications in their original containers. The patient’s name may be crossed out.
- ✓ Place all pharmaceutical items in a plastic bag(s) and keep them separate from other items brought to the program.
- ✓ Participants do not have to provide their name – just the name of the community where they live.

Items Accepted

- Pills & Capsules
- Syrups / Liquids
- Salves / Creams
- Inhalers
- Vet/Pet Meds

Items Not Accepted

- ⊗ Radioactive Materials
- ⊗ Sharps/Needles
- ⊗ Oxygen Tanks
- ⊗ Nebulizers
- ⊗ Cosmetics

Clean Sweep Does Not Accept:

- ⊗ Alkaline batteries
- ⊗ Ammunition/explosives
- ⊗ Compressed gas cylinders
- ⊗ Computer items and other electronics
- ⊗ Household cleaning products that are usable
- ⊗ Latex Paint (*Latex paint is a water-based product that is not “hazardous.” Paint should be dried out and once it is hard and dry, it may be placed in the regular trash.*)
- ⊗ Radioactive items
- ⊗ Tires
