

Display – All On-Street Parking Permits must be displayed on the vehicle's **rear windshield (driver's side)**. Motorcycles may display decals on a front windshield, front fork, rear shock, fender, or oil/battery cover.

All Night/Early Hang Tag Permits must be on the vehicle's rear-view mirror.

Vehicles must be pulled into the parking stall so that the permit is easily viewed (no backing into the stall).

All out-dated permits are to be removed from vehicles.

PARKING TICKET APPEAL PROCESS

If you feel that you have received a parking ticket in error, you may contact the **Whitewater Police Department** at **(262) 473-0555**, or by visiting the Department at 312 W. Whitewater Street.

Invalid reasons for appeal include (but are not limited to):

- ◆ Lack of knowledge of the City's parking regulations.
- ◆ Appointment conflicts or tardiness going to or returning from appointments.
- ◆ Inability to find a legal parking space.
- ◆ Parking in permit areas beyond the time restrictions due to work conflicts.

Locations – City of Whitewater Downtown Employee Parking Permits are only valid in the locations designated and signed for permit parking. A map of all downtown parking, including designated permit spaces, is provided within this brochure. Permit parking spaces are clearly identified with signage in municipal lots and on city streets.

- ◆ Downtown On-Street Parking Permits are valid only from **7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday – Saturday.**
- ◆ Night/Early Hangtag Permits are valid for municipal lot parking between the hours of **9:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.**
- ◆ Parking spaces are available on a **first-come, first-served** basis; therefore, parking spaces are **not guaranteed** for downtown employees.
- ◆ The Whitewater Police Department strictly enforces permit parking regulations.
- ◆ Any vehicle parked without a permit is subject to the posted time restriction for that space.
- ◆ Violators will be subject to fines of \$20 and, where appropriate, towing at the owner's expense.

Exemptions – Service or delivery vehicles while operating in regulated areas. Private autos, motorcycles and pickup trucks may park in all on-street spaces, subject to time restrictions.



DOWNTOWN ON-STREET PARKING PERMITS AND/OR NIGHT/EARLY HANG TAG PERMITS

Purpose – Employees who work in the downtown business district **must display** a Downtown Parking Permit when parking in **designated** on-street spots or within municipal lots. These permits are intended to provide convenient parking options for Whitewater's downtown employees while preserving prime parking for customers and visitors to the city's downtown.

Eligibility – Individuals who are employed by firms or businesses in operation in downtown Whitewater may purchase the On-Street permits with satisfactory proof of employment such as an original letter and signature from the owner or manager of the place of business. Business owners must purchase the Night/Early hangtags, providing satisfactory proof of ownership at a downtown business,

Purchase – All parking permits are sold at the Municipal Building's Police Department lobby window, 312 W. Whitewater Street, between 8:00 am and 4:30 pm, Monday through Friday .

◆ **Permits are sold annually (June 1st through May 31st) at a cost of \$40 for On-Street and/or \$50 for Night /Early**

Refunds – Permits may be returned to the Police Department lobby window, 8:00 am through 4:30 pm, Monday through Friday for a prorated refund if the permit holder no longer works in the downtown area. **Permits may not be sold or transferred to another person.**

Stolen or Lost Permits – If your permit is lost or stolen a new permit must be purchased. If the permit is stolen in the City of Whitewater, report the theft to the Whitewater Police Department.
